**Q4. What is the maximum permitted speed for a heavy operational vehicle responding under lights and siren on the open road?**

**Q5. What is the maximum permitted speed in a 50 km/h zone when responding under lights and siren to an emergency?**

**Q6. What is the maximum speed limit through a temporary speed zone?**

**Q7. What is the maximum speeds permitted at intersections controlled by lights, stop or give way signs in an emergency response?**

**Q8. When may the driver of a NZFS vehicle use a handheld cellphone?**

**Q9. What is the maximum number of BA cylinders that may be transported in a NZFS vehicle other than a BA Tender?**

**Q10. How many persons are permitted to be carried in a NZFS vehicle?**
